## “One Body, One Spirit, One Voice”

### The Revised Roman Missal: Advent, 2011

Change is a sign that we the Church are alive, growing, and moving forward? With a goal toward making the liturgy even more beautiful, inclusive, and universal, we will experience changes in the Mass for the first time in nearly 40 years (since the Second Vatican Council). On the first Sunday of Advent (November 27, 2011), some of the prayers of the Mass will change, although the structure of the liturgy will remain the same. The new prayers will include those said by the celebrant (priest) as well as responses spoken by the people.

To ensure that our parish family is familiar and comfortable with the new prayers – and is ready to worship as One Body, One Spirit, One Voice, at the start of Advent – we will be publishing a series of flyers/worship aids in the bulletin and on our website.

#### **What exactly is the Roman Missal?**

- Contains all prayers of the Mass for the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church.
- Includes prayers said by both the celebrant (priest) and the people.
- Originally published in Latin in 1474 as *Missale Romanum*.
- From the early Church until the Second Vatican Council, the prayers of the liturgy were spoken in Latin, while preaching and teaching employed the common language of the people.
- In the 1970's, the Second Vatican Council allowed for translation of the liturgy into the common language (vernacular) of the people, with the goal of promoting "...full, conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations. . ."

#### **Why is Liturgy vital to our Roman Catholic faith?**

- It is the source and summit of the church's life – and **WE** are the Church?
- In Liturgy, we stand as a faith community in witness to the reality of eternity, affirming that we are on a communal journey to our final (our *real*) destination.
- In the Liturgy, we join with Christ Himself in his prayer to the Father. Our prayer takes on the power of his words, raising us up in Christ.
- Liturgy joins us together in worship on many levels: in speech, in song, in gesture, and in mind and heart.
- Liturgy is never evaluated like a performance: no matter how eloquent the homily or how beautiful the music, we know we are not there to be "entertained" but – as One Body, One Spirit, One Voice -- to offer praise and worship, through Christ, to the Father.

*"The heart of our Sunday obligation is **gratitude**. The word Eucharist means 'to give thanks.' We come together to give thanks to God our Father, who is the source of all life and creation, and to Jesus, God's Son, who gave us eternal life through his death on the Cross, made present in every Mass as we participate again in Christ's death and Resurrection through the Eucharist."* Maureen Kelly, MA
